For institutions, teachers, and students



# NORDTRAD NETWORK

The first official Nordtrad Folk Music Network meeting was organized in 1999 between Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Norway, and Sweden.

The network consists of 15 member institutions.

#### **Organization:**

Working group with one representative from each country The current chairman is Pär Moberg from Malmö The current administrator is Centria UAS The 2026 Annual Forum will be hosted by Malmö.





#### Activities:

An annual forum for students and teachers in April with workshops, lectures, concerts, jam sessions, mixed ensembles, and pedagogical and artistic discussions.

Usually, around 130 students and 20 teachers join the forum.

Financed by Nordplus mobility grants for students and organizational or Erasmus funding for teachers.

Other activities: Curriculum development, information exchange, joint study programmes, teacher and student mobilities.

New activity: Nordtrad Seminar for folk music master's students at KMH in Stockholm, 24th-28th of September 2025. An opportunity to meet, network, and present ongoing work, projects, and research.



The **Nordtrad Manual** presents the principles of the network's operations and informs about:

- Organizational structure and financing
- Chair, Working Group and Coordinator tasks
- Membership
- Teacher and student mobility
- The Nordic Master program (receives some financing)
- Other forms of mobilities
- History of the Nordtrad network






